Notes:	When there is a wind chill, ignore the "actual" temperature and go with the windchill temperature. Eg. If it is "-10°C Feels like -20°C" you should consider it -20°C outside. This example is based on the needs of my 10 year old Quarter Horse Gelding Mac, he is a hard keeper, who eats approx. one small square bale per day, and around 3lbs or concentrate feeds per day. He has always had a tendency to be colder then the other horses I have owned. He lives 24/7 outside with a run-in shed as his shelter. The paddock is located in a wooded area, where hills and mountains block most of the wind. He also has tendency toward skin issues caused by wet conditions.
